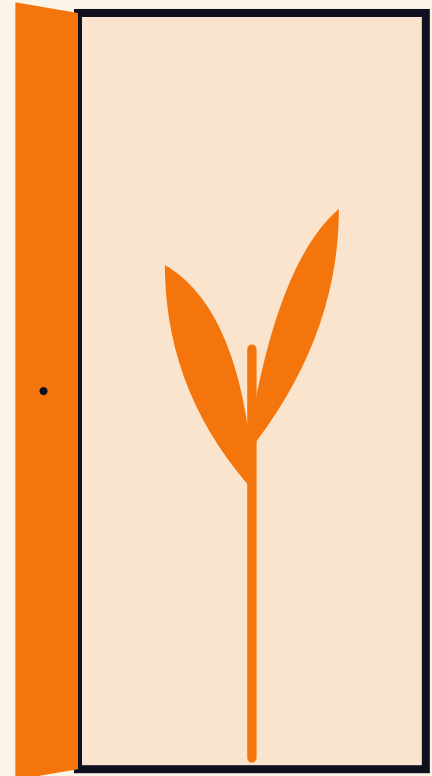

— WHY THIS MATTERS

Google is your encyclopedia, doctor, and dictionary — all in one.

Google is the world's biggest library. It has answers to every question you can imagine — from 'how do I cook poha' to 'what time does the bank open' to 'what is the weather tomorrow'.

And it's all free. You just need to know how to ask.

STEP 1 OF 6

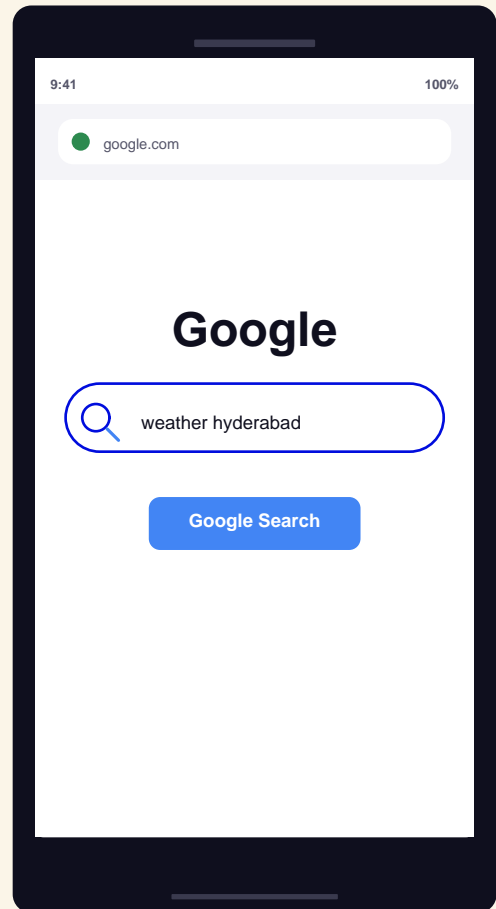
Open Google

On your phone, find the Google app — a colorful icon with the letter G.

If you don't have it, you can also use Chrome browser (the round red-yellow-green-blue icon) and type 'google.com'.

TIP

On most Android phones, Google is already installed. Look on your home screen.





2

STEP 2 OF 6

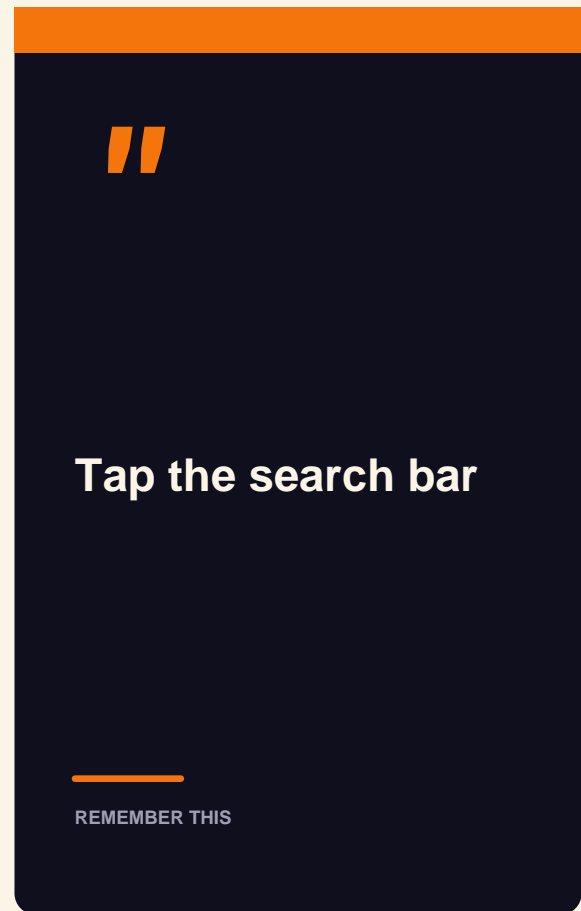
Tap the search bar

You'll see a long white bar at the top with 'Search' or 'Google' written inside it.

Tap it once. The keyboard opens, ready for you to type.

TIP

If a microphone icon appears in the search bar, you can tap that and speak instead of typing.

STEP 3 OF 6

Ask in plain language

Type your question like you'd ask a friend:

- 'What is the weather in Hyderabad today'
- 'How to make rasam'
- 'Apollo hospital near me'
- 'Train from Hyderabad to Mumbai'

You don't need to be polite or use full sentences. Google understands.

● **TIP**

Keep it short — 3 to 6 words is usually enough. 'rasam recipe' is better than 'how do I make a good rasam'.

Ask Google like a friend. Short questions work best.

REMEMBER THIS

STEP 4 OF 6

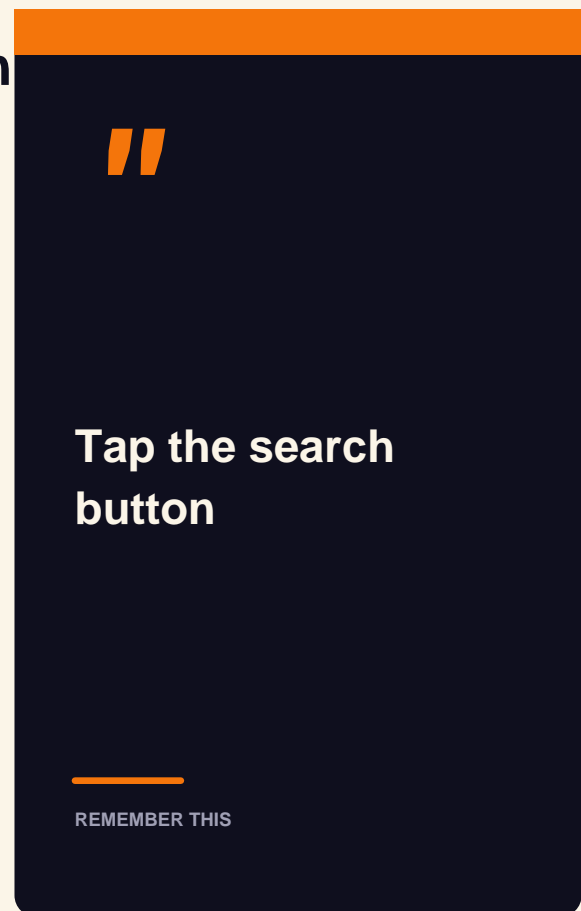
Tap the search button

After typing, look at the bottom-right of the keyboard for a blue button — it might say 'Search' or have a magnifying glass icon.

Tap it. Google shows you the answers.

TIP

Most phones also let you press Enter on the keyboard — same effect.





5

STEP 5 OF 6

Read the results — top is best

Google shows a list of websites that have your answer. The TOP results are usually the best.

Often, you don't even need to click anything — Google shows the answer in a box right at the top.



WARNING

Some results are ads — they have a small 'Ad' or 'Sponsored' label. These are paid, not always best. Skip them.

Top results = best results.

REMEMBER THIS

STEP 6 OF 6

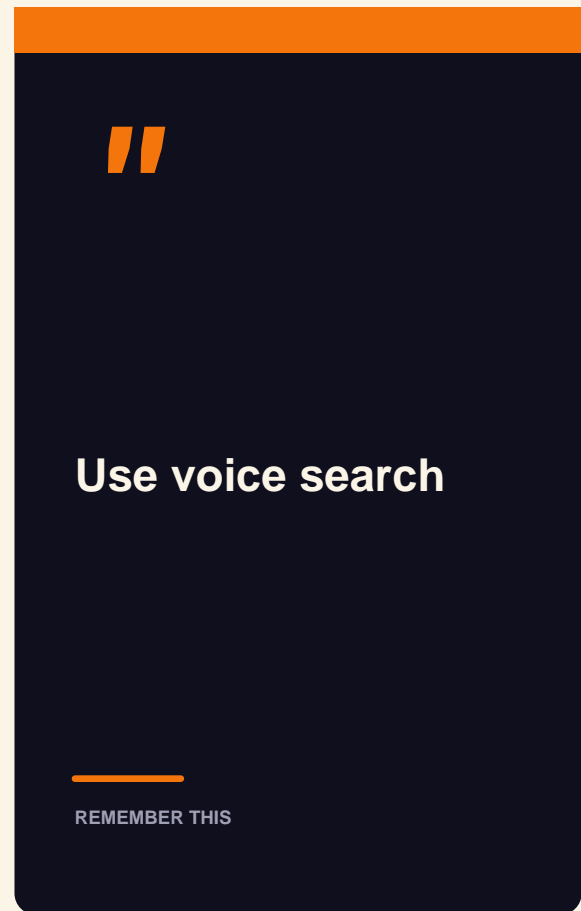
Use voice search

On the search bar, tap the small microphone icon.

Speak your question naturally: 'What is the weather today?' Google listens and shows the answer in seconds. No typing needed.

TIP

Voice search works in Hindi, Telugu, Tamil, Marathi, Bengali, and many more languages.





QUICK RECAP

Google in 5 simple ideas.

1

Google = the world's library

Anything you want to know — Google has it. Free, instant, in your language.

2

Short questions are better

Type 3-6 words, like 'weather Hyderabad' or 'doctor near me'. No need for full sentences.

3

Top result is usually best

Google ranks the most useful results at the top. Skip the ones marked 'Ad'.

4

Voice search saves typing

Tap the mic icon and speak. Google understands Hindi, Telugu, Tamil, English — all of them.

5

If wrong, ask differently

If results aren't useful, change your words. 'Best rasam recipe' instead of 'rasam'.
