



Scan. Pay. Done. *Even faster than typing.*

Black-and-white squares are everywhere — at shops, on auto-rickshaws, at vegetable carts. Each one is a QR code. Scan it and pay in 10 seconds.

— WHY THIS MATTERS

QR codes mean no more typing numbers.

A QR code is a black-and-white pattern of squares. It looks confusing, but for your phone, it's a name and bank account written in code.

When you scan a QR code with your UPI app, the phone reads it instantly. You just type the amount and pay. No typing of numbers, no mistakes.

STEP 1 OF 5

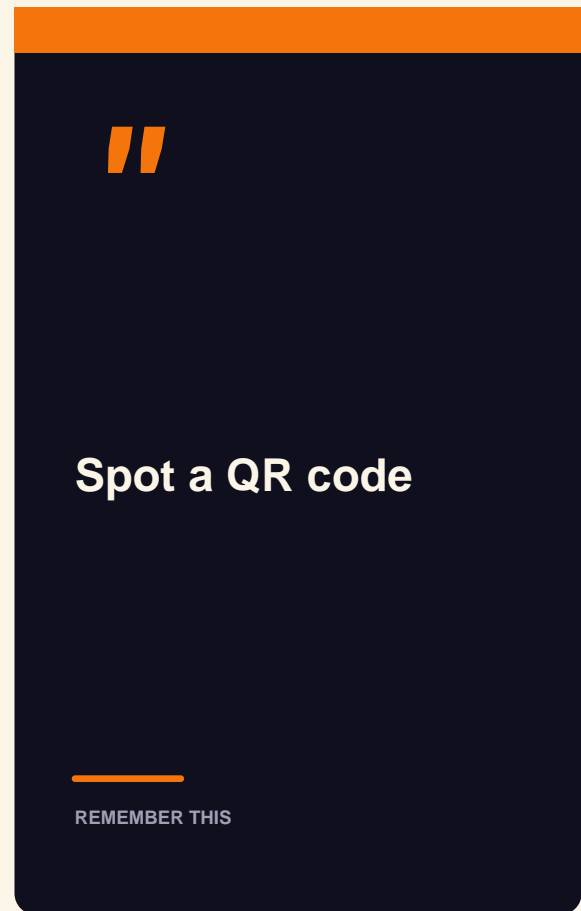
Spot a QR code

QR codes are square pictures with black-and-white dots. You'll see them on:

- Shop counters
- Auto-rickshaws
- Restaurant menus
- Vegetable carts
- Bills and packages

TIP

Bigger QR codes scan faster. Smaller ones need you to hold the phone closer.

STEP 2 OF 5

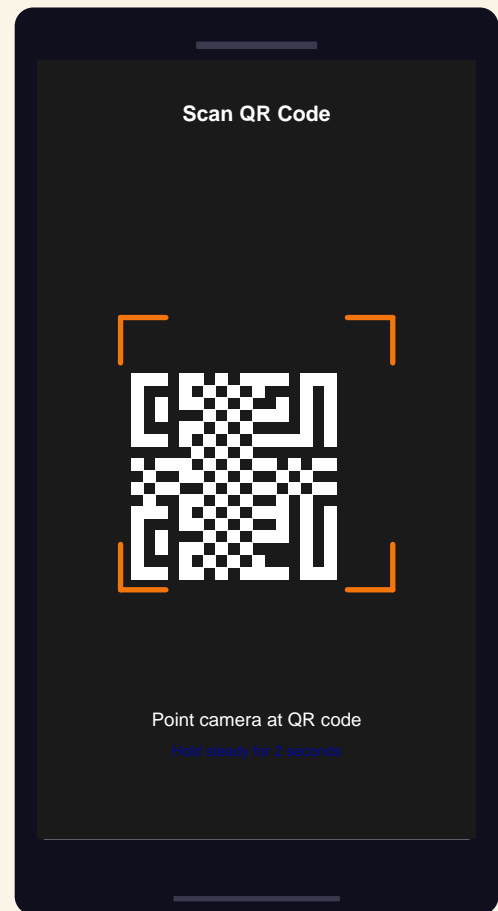
Open your UPI app's scanner

On the home screen of GPay, PhonePe, or Paytm, you'll see a 'Scan' or 'Scan QR' option.

Tap it. Your phone's camera turns on, ready to scan.

TIP

If the app asks for camera permission, tap 'Allow'. Your camera is needed to scan.

STEP 3 OF 5

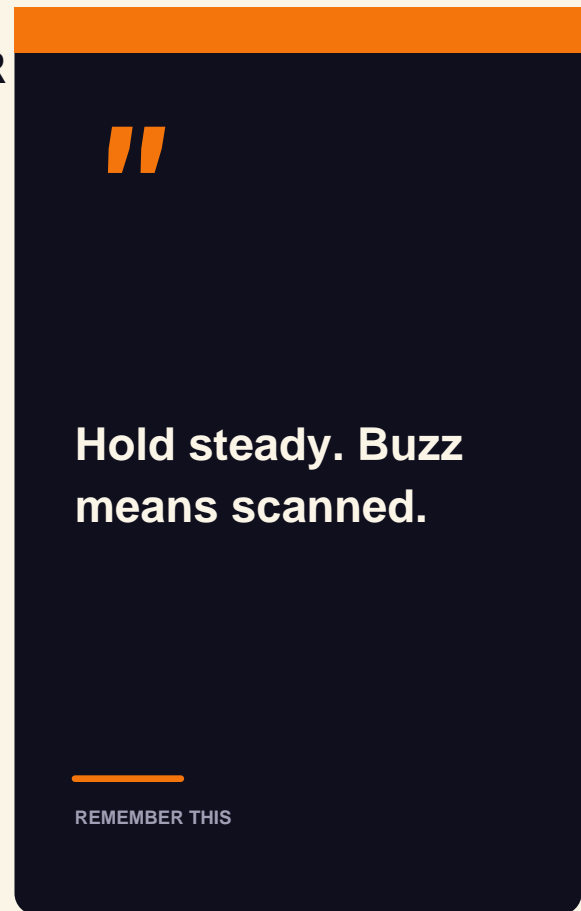
Point your phone at the QR code

Hold your phone steady, about 15-20 cm away from the QR code.

Make sure the entire square fits inside the bracket on your screen. The phone scans automatically — usually in 1-2 seconds. You'll feel a small buzz when it works.

TIP

If it's not scanning, try moving your phone closer or further away. Good light helps too.

STEP 4 OF 5

Check the name

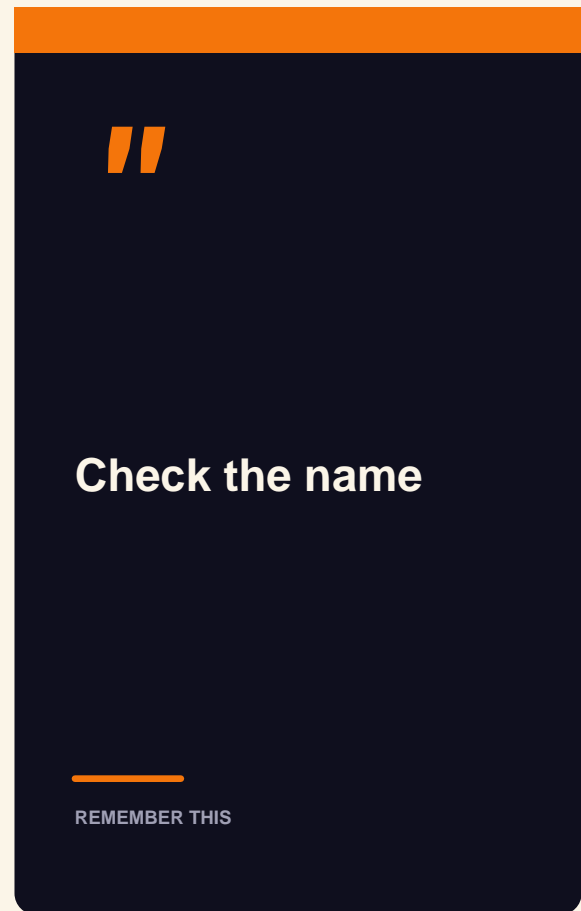
After scanning, the app shows you the shop or person's name.

Read it carefully. If you're paying at 'Sai Krupa Hotel', the name should say something close to that. If the name looks totally different — STOP. Don't pay.



WARNING

Scammers stick fake QR codes over real ones. If the name on screen doesn't match the shop, walk away. Pay cash or skip.

STEP 5 OF 5

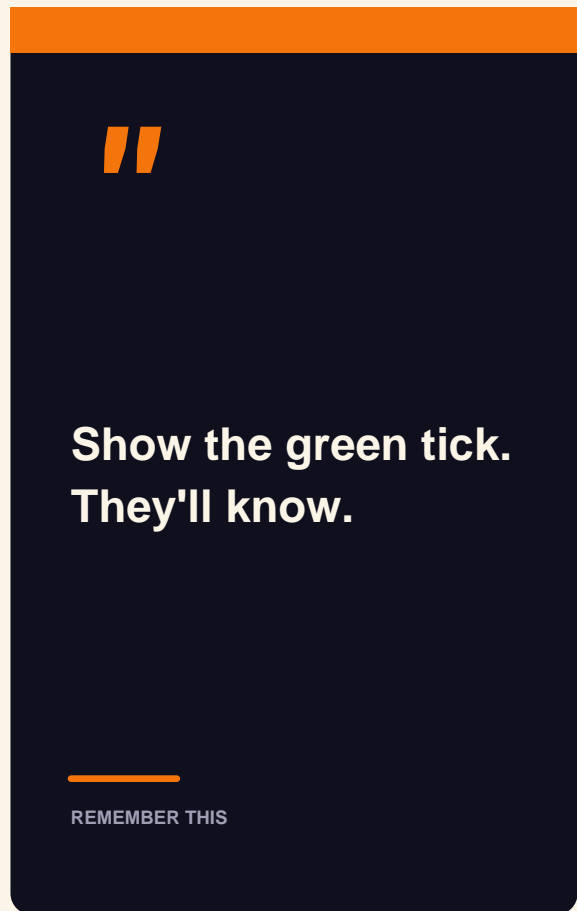
Type amount and pay

Most QR codes don't have an amount. You type it.

Some restaurant or shop QRs have the amount built in. Just review and tap Pay. Enter your UPI PIN. You'll see the green success tick.

TIP

After paying, show the success screen to the shopkeeper as proof. They'll see it in their phone too within seconds.





QUICK RECAP

Pay with a scan.

1

QR code = bank account, in code

The black-and-white squares hold the shop's bank details. Your phone reads it for you.

2

Open Scan in your UPI app

Every UPI app has a 'Scan' button on the home screen. Tap it. Camera opens.

3

Hold steady, 15-20 cm away

Fit the QR code inside the bracket. The phone scans in 1-2 seconds. You feel a small buzz.

4

Always check the name

After scanning, the app shows the shop's name. Match it to where you are. If wrong — don't pay.

5

Show the green tick

After paying, show the success screen to the shopkeeper. They see it on their phone too.
