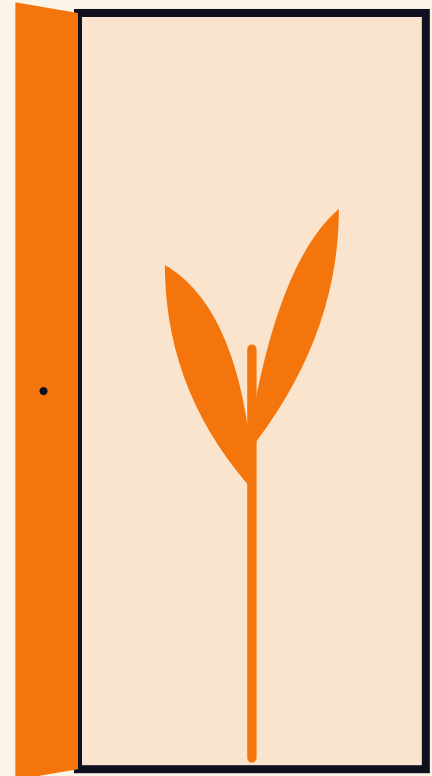




A cab to your door. *In 3 minutes.*

No more standing on the road. No more haggling on price. Open Ola, Uber, or Rapido, type where you're going, and a ride arrives in minutes.



WHAT'S INSIDE

- ✓ Open the app
- ✓ Type your destination
- ✓ Track the ride coming



WHY THIS MATTERS

Ola, Uber, and Rapido bring a ride to wherever you stand.

Ola, Uber, and Rapido are apps that connect you with thousands of drivers. You tell the app where you are and where you're going. The app finds the nearest driver and sends them to you.

Price is shown BEFORE the trip. No haggling. Pay with UPI or cash. Ride safely with a known driver and tracked vehicle.

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN

- Open the app and allow location
- Choose where you're going
- Pick the right cab type
- Wait for and recognize the car

 *Takes about 5 minutes to read*

STEP 1 OF 6

Open Ola, Uber, or Rapido

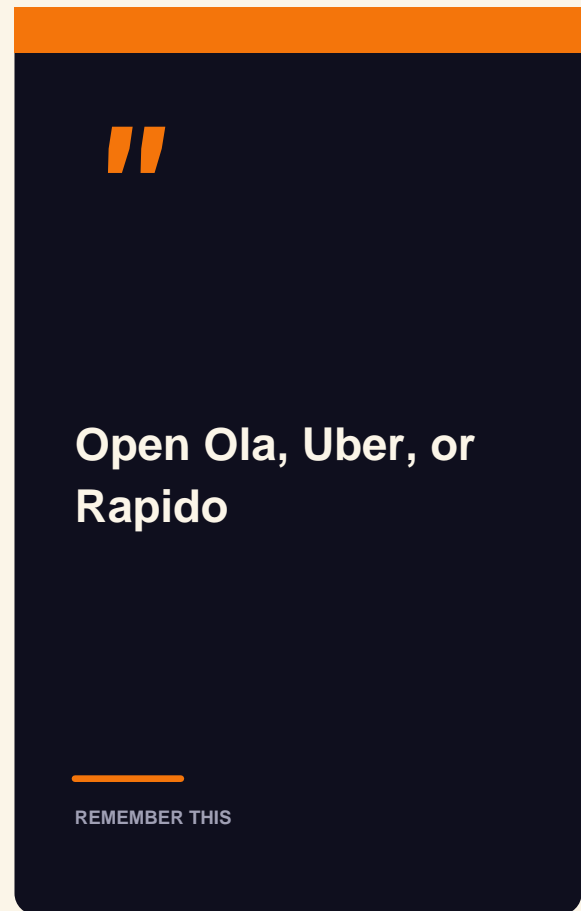
Find the app on your home screen:

- Ola (yellow icon)
- Uber (black icon)
- Rapido (yellow icon, often cheapest)

Tap once to open. The first time, the app asks for your location. Tap 'Allow While Using App' — this lets the app find where you are.

● **TIP**

If you don't have these, get them free from the Play Store. Rapido often has the cheapest auto and cab fares — worth installing alongside Ola/Uber.

STEP 2 OF 6

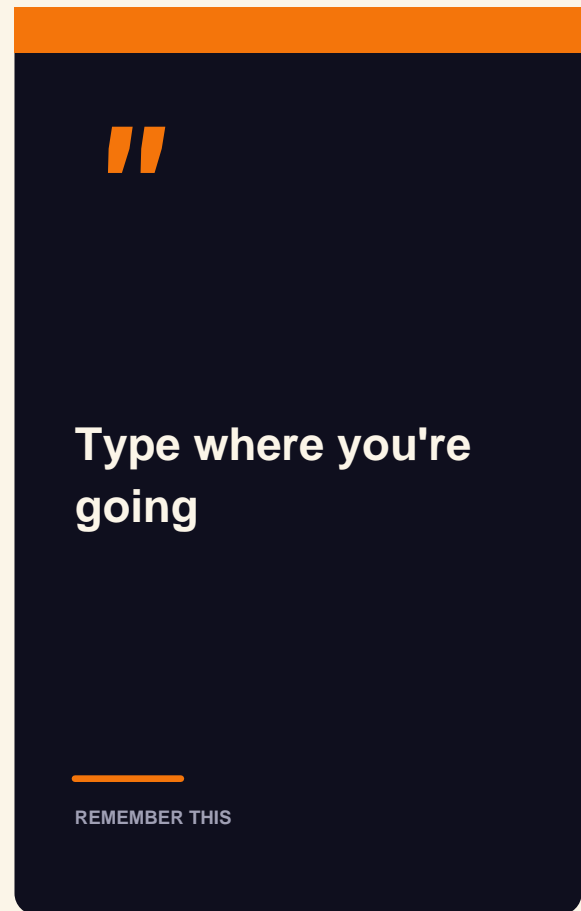
Type where you're going

On the home screen you'll see 'Where to?' or 'Enter destination'.

Tap it. Type the place name — 'Apollo Hospital' or 'Begumpet Station' or any address. The app shows suggestions. Tap the correct one.

TIP

You don't need a full address. The name of a famous place works perfectly.

STEP 3 OF 6

Pick a ride type

The app shows different ride options:

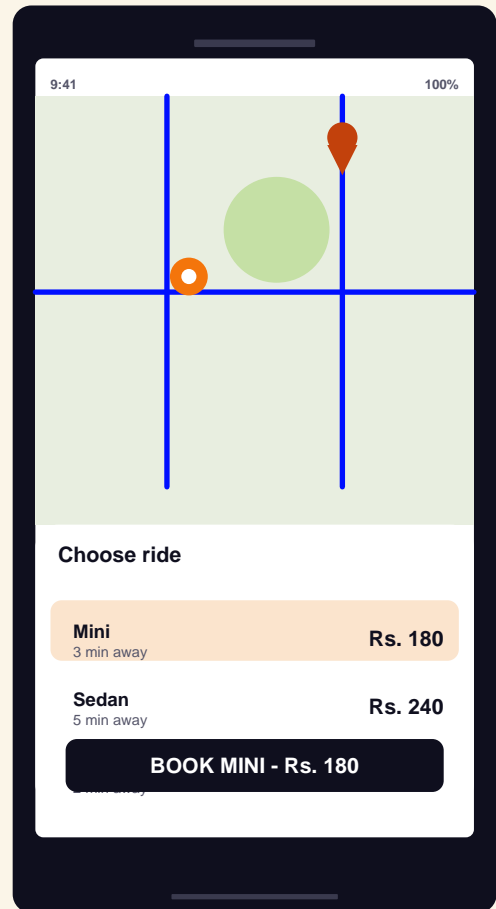
- Bike — cheapest (Rapido is famous for this)
- Auto / Auto-rickshaw — cheap, all 3 apps
- Mini — small car, cheap
- Sedan / Prime — bigger, comfortable
- SUV — biggest, most expensive

Each shows price + how soon the ride arrives.



WARNING

Skip BIKE rides if you are elderly. They are cheaper but unsafe — no seatbelts, no roof, no protection in a fall. Stick to Auto, Mini, or Sedan.

STEP 4 OF 6

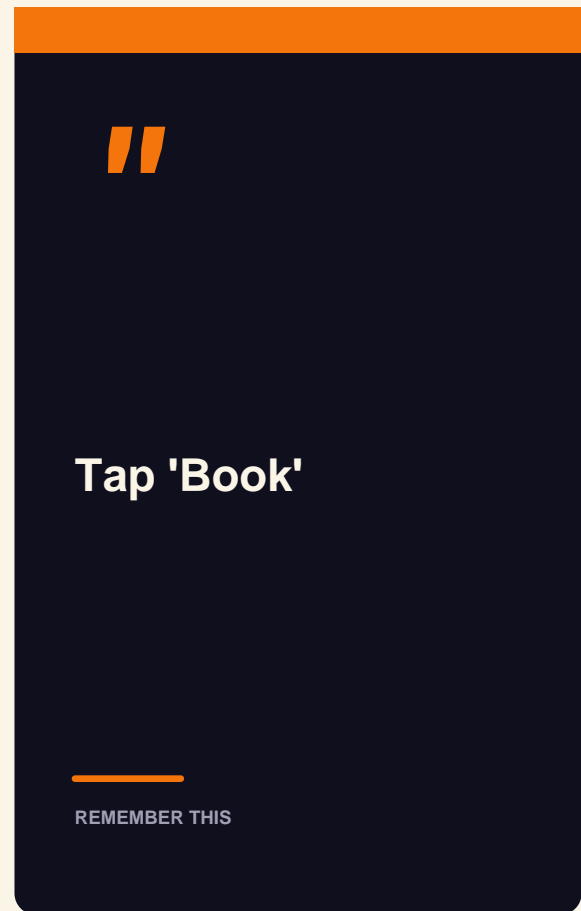
Tap 'Book'

Once you pick a ride type, tap the big button at the bottom — 'Book Mini' or 'Confirm Booking'.

The app finds you a driver. In 30 seconds, you'll see the driver's name, photo, car number, and how far they are.

TIP

If no drivers are nearby, the app will say so. Try a different ride type or wait 5 minutes.

STEP 5 OF 6

Match vehicle number with screen

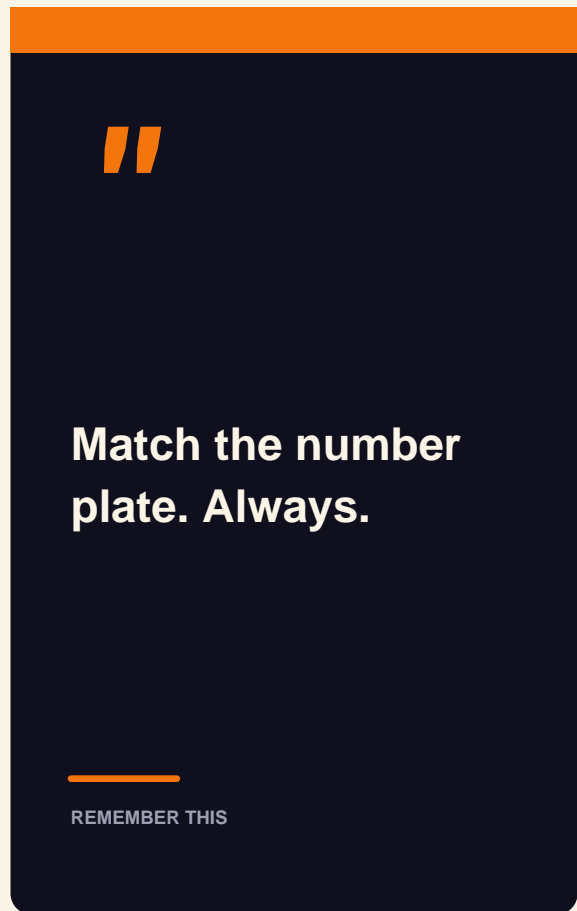
When the ride arrives, look at the registration number plate (white letters on black or white background).

It **MUST** match the number shown on your app screen. Like 'TS09EJ1234'. If the number doesn't match — that's not your ride. Don't get in. Same rule for autos and bikes.



WARNING

Always match the number plate with what the app shows. Many drivers offer rides to fool tourists. Your real ride will have the EXACT number on your screen.

STEP 6 OF 6

Pay at the end

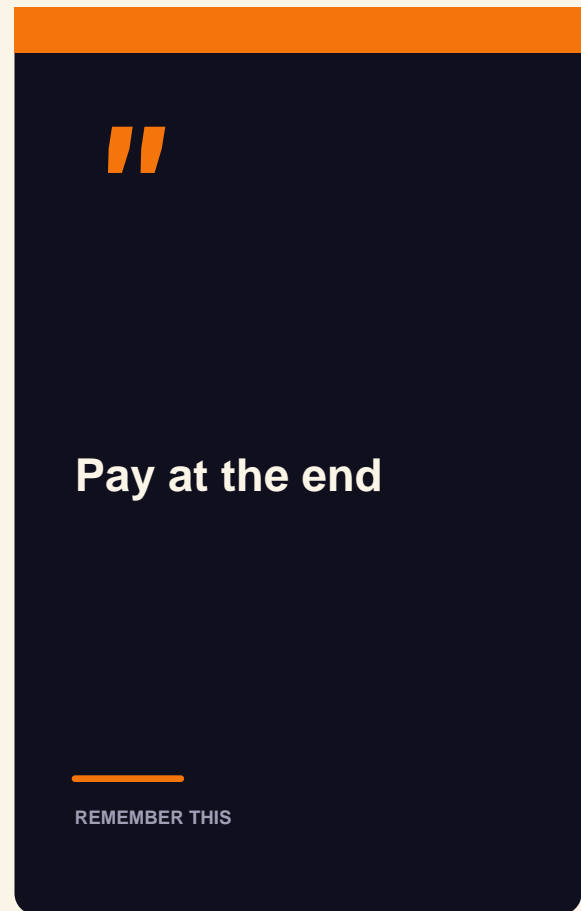
When the trip ends, the app shows the final price. You pay:

- By UPI (the app shows a Pay button)
- By cash to the driver
- By card linked in the app

If using cash, give the exact amount or close to it. Drivers often have no change.

TIP

After the trip, you'll be asked to rate the driver. 5 stars if all was good. This helps other riders.





QUICK RECAP

Rides the safe way.

1 Three good apps to choose from

Ola, Uber, and Rapido. Rapido often has the cheapest auto and cab fares. Install all three — pick whichever is cheapest each time.

2 Famous place names work

Type 'Apollo Hospital' instead of full address. The app's suggestions are usually right.

3 Skip bikes if you're elderly

Bike rides are cheaper but unsafe — no seatbelt, no roof. Always pick Auto, Mini, or Sedan instead.

4 ALWAYS check the number plate

Before getting in, match the vehicle number plate with the number on your screen. Exactly.

5 Pay UPI or cash

When trip ends, tap 'Pay by UPI' or hand cash to the driver. Both are fine.
